Profile

Founded in 1954 by the Marist Brothers, Marist High School is a private Catholic, coeducational, four-year college preparatory school, which is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and a member of the Marist Network of Schools.

Marist is a modern structure with thirty-five classrooms, lecture rooms, laboratories for physics, chemistry, biology and conceptual physics, two art studios, a music studio and three computer labs. A state-of-the-art Library Media Center, a guidance complex with a career resource center, a beautiful chapel, together with a large gymnasium-auditorium complex and a spacious cafeteria, complete the school building.

Bayonne is located among the 11 municipalities which comprise Hudson County, a county with an approximate population of 634,000. This urban community is directly west of New York City and reflects broad ethnic and economic diversity. The school draws a considerable number of students from Hudson, Essex, and Union Counties.

Curriculum Features

Marist High School offers three academic tracks: Advanced Placement, Honors and College Preparatory. A Study Skills Program is integrated into the freshman curriculum. Likewise, a Writing Program is incorporated into the sophomore year. A compensatory education program, designed to remediate basic skills deficiencies in English and Math, are offered in an after-school program. All students are also required to qualify for the Presidential Fitness Program. Electives are offered in a variety of departments including art, music, science, technology, and social studies. Seniors may elect to take high school and/or college online courses or an Independent Study under a faculty mentor.

Advanced Features

English is offered for college credit, Calculus, World History, European History, American History, Spanish, Programming and Studio Art.

Honors Level Courses

Courses are offered in English I, II, III, IV, Algebra, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, U.S. History I, II, World Civilizations, Conceptual Physics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Spanish I, II.
